Swing shift calls for service were busy all night. At approximately 8:30pm we received a sound of shots fired in the area of Pioneer and Main St. Officers checked the area but nothing was located. About an hour later we received an anonymous call stating a responsible living in an apartment in the area had been the one firing the gun.
