An elderly female was determined to be gravely disabled in her home, placed on a hold and transported to the hospital. A male with mental health issues assaulted his elderly mother and resisted officers. He had a warrant for his arrest for resting in the past. He was arrested for elder abuse, resisting and the warrant. He had to be placed in the WRAP restraint device due to his combative behavior prior to transporting him to jail. A female was reportedly screaming and throwing rocks at a building and cars. She was contacted and arrested/booked for public intoxication.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

It was another busy day for swing shift. The shift started off with one of our cadets finding a dog that was in a vehicle, parked in the sun with no owners nearby. The windows were rolled up and the dog seemed to be extremely hot. Additionally, there was no water in the vehicle. Animal control responded and after a few minutes, the owners arrived. The dog was checked for wellbeing and the owner cited for leaving it in a hot vehicle. Animal control will follow up and check in on the dog. Officers also arrested a male for robbery. He was not happy that several juveniles were playing with "orbies" water gel guns. He confronted several of the juveniles, scaring them, and then ripping the water guns from the juvenile's hands. He was located and arrested. None of the juveniles were injured. SIU was present today and they made a large impact on the response to calls. They arrested 3 subjects for warrants during their shift.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

An officer contacted several males trespassing on private property. One of the males had a warrant ad another male was refusing to follow directives from the officer during lawful commands. That male was arrested for resisting/delaying. Both males were arrested and released with a citation after being trespass admonished. Later in the night an officer saw a male riding a bike in the wrong direction. The officer recognized the male and knew he had warrants. While trying to stop the male, the male rode off on his bike trying to flee the officer. After a short pursuit the male was apprehended. He was determined to have 6 warrants. He was booked on the warrants and for resisting the officer. An officer also contacted a female at a park who was displaying obvious signs of being under the influence of a controlled substance. She was unable to care for herself and also had a warrant for her arrest. She was taken to jail.
