He will be wanted for felony narcotics possession charges upon his release from the hospital, due to several prior convictions he has for narcotics possessions.

It was the typical call volume at the start of swing shift with calls for service starting to come in. One call was dispatched as an assault & battery in-progress between a male and female behind a business. One caller reported the male had slapped the female in the face. When officers arrived there was some difficulty communicating with both parties who primarily spoke Vietnamese. With the help of the language translation line, officers were able to determine that the female had went to her ex-husbands work to accuse him of seeing another woman, calling him a cheater. She then began hitting the male and would not allow him to leave. The male eventually slapped the female back to get away. The female was arrested and booked for domestic battery.
